## Club or Sport Description

Art Club	Open Art Studio or Art Club students are able to work on choice projects. This is a great time for students to catch up on projects from art class, or to create artwork completely free from learning targets. All students are welcome.
Best Buddies	Connect IDD students with a Peer Buddy to create meaningful friendships. Meetings in the beginning educate students on IDD and mentoring expectations and behaviors, Meetings November to June are parties for the students to have fun and interact. Currently all students are allowed to participate, however maturity in your student to work with an IDD student is encouraged.
Board Game Club	The Board Game Club is intended to bring all grades of middle school students together to exercise creativity and utilize problem solving skills while competing and working together. It is a laid back environment in which students can make new friends and embrace old ones. They are encouraged to bring a game they like from home to share.
Cross Country	Cross Country Club meets in the Fall and accepts all grades. The goal of Cross Country is to get kids out running and active increasing endurance through runs and running games. Our goal is to meet students where they are at in their running and endurance and increase their skills.
Explorer's Club	The Explorers' Club provides social opportunities for students outside of school hours. There is no club fee however students pay for the cost of the trip and bring extra money for food. Chaperones are needed and welcome. We do not have club meetings. Past trips: 8th grade went to Fright Fest at Six Flags and Blue Man Group in Chicago. 7th Grade went tubing at Sunburst in Kewaskum. There is limited space for trips so return permission slips ASAP.
Forensics	The purpose of Forensics is to help the kids become better public speakers and become more comfortable speaking in front of people they do not know. There are no skills needed to join and we welcome everyone!
Jazz Ensemble	Students in Jazz Ensemble learn melodies, improvisation, technique, and Jazz history. Jazz Ensemble is open for instrumental music students in 7th and 8th grade on their primary instrument or by audition with the instructor.
Lego League	Students build Lego NXT robots then program them. The students take on various mini-project challenges which guides their robot design and programming.
MathCounts	MathCounts is a national program for those students who love math and the challenge to solve story problems.
Media Club	Media club is the after school group that is responsible for producing our weekly video announcements and sharing the great things that are going on at KMMS. The club meets once a week (typically on Mondays).
Musical	The musical is a full Broadway Junior production that occurs once a year. Students must audition early in the year and not all students make it into the production.
Robotics STEM	Students use the VEX Robotics kits to design and program robots to solve problems. Students work collaboratively in small groups.
Rockestra	The Kettle Moraine Rockestra is an extra-curricular group that meets during the school day once a week. Students are expected to work on the repertoire outside of school individually. We will perform before a Bucks game, and at various other orchestra concerts throughout the year. Rockestra is also a course offered in the summer.
Student Senate	Students work together on planning dances, spirit days, planning a school fundraiser to sponsor a family during the holidays, making signs, and other activities. All students that participate have leadership opportunities.
Co-Ed Volleyball	Students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grade can participate in intramural co-ed volleyball. This activity is typically run the end of November through January - after school until 4 PM. We try to get about 10 playing dates, with the emphasis on playing the game of volleyball in a less competitive setting with great sportsmanship.
Woodwind Choir	Band students in 7th and 8th grade band can participate in this group. We will meet after school once a week from 2:40 until 4 pm to practice. We take a field trip to play for Three Pillars and the Delafield Library to perform for the community.
Girls' Basketball	Middle School Basketball is a great place to learn strong fundamentals and advanced technique that will give a solid foundation for future play. Coaches stress teamwork, good sportsmanship, and strong character on and off the court. Grades 7 & 8 only. Junior Parkland Conference
