The Department of Health and Human Services provides confidential Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (AODA) for chemically dependent persons and their families.

Services include: diagnostic evaluation/referral, individual and group therapy, intensive outpatient, dual disability treatment, intoxicated driver program, detoxification. Fees are charged for some of these services. Where applicable, such fees are computed according to state ability to pay guidelines.

Persons needing additional structure and support may be referred to hospitals, day or evening outpatient treatment programs, day treatment and/or halfway houses in the community. Education and community awareness sessions are an integral part of the programming.
